Take up activities for the overall development and leadership building of Adivasi youth and children; Build awareness through writing, publishing, disseminating information and organizing cultural programmes for the preservation, lobby and protection of tribal rights and heritage.

Promote traditional sustainable forest protection and regeneration practices of the Adivasi's for conservation of the forest and natural resources and striving for Adivasi control over them for protection of environment and ecology of the hills of the Eastern Ghats.

Adivasimahasabha

Adivasimitra achieved 5525 membership for Adivasimahasabha in this project year. The spread of this activity reached 504 villages. 933 Gramamitras representing 504 villages and facilitating the village level services, government programs and schemes reach doorsteps of tribal families. Because of the trainings and awareness programs under Adivasimahasabha Members are aware of government schemes and able to identify issues related to Ration Cards, Pensions, MGNREGS Job Cards, Housing, Drinking water, Title Deeds, Prohibition of alcohol, Anganwadi building, Road, Drainage, Toilets, SHG Loans, Agri loans and Irrigation facilities in village meetings. With the assistance of community facilitators and coordinators Mahasabha members are able to approach appropriate authorities to resolve the household, village level problems. Orientation and consultation meetings helped in achieving this by creating awareness and motivating the villagers.

From the efforts of Adivasi Mahasabha Rs.25,50,000 worth drinking water project sanctioned for Parvathipuram village of Lagisapalle Panchayat of Paderu Mandal following the representation of Mahasabha members in ITDA.

Trainings and meetings conducted on RoFR, PESA and other acts created a positive response among the members of Adivasi mahasabha to delayed sanction of title deeds. Mahasabha members spontaneously participated in a rally requesting sanction of land titles, process rejected claims under RoFR. (Not a planned activity).

Adivasi Members have also participated in an all party conference on 1/70 act, occupation of lands by non Adivasi communities. . Adivasi mahasabha members from Pedabayalumandal conducted social audit on corruption of Development officer (MPDO) of Pedabayalu. There was fraud in construction of toilets for around 1600 houses, in 23 panchayats of Pedabayalumandal.

Mahasabha members visited the constructions, audited and confirmed the corruption. Organised a round table meeting, created awareness among the beneficiaries. Sub collector of Paderu division responded to the issue and Suspended the MPDO following an enquiry.

Mutually Aided Cooperative Society (MACS):

By the end of the year Adivasimitra joined 1264 farmers in Manyam Cooperative society. Created 60 farmer producer groups.

Efforts made in group marketing yielded positive results. 3 groups in Paderu and Hukumpeta mandal started collective marketing. The three groups started selling Add leaf (leaves used to make leaf plates), Ground nut. The three groups gross sale amount is Rs.1,18,600

55 farmers were provided financial assistance to cultivate Ragi (Chodi/ Finger Millet) and paddy under SRI method. Farmers were provided training and guidance.

Awareness on cheating of businessmen in weights and measures was created in 12 weekly traditional market places (Shandy) every month. Staff attended assisted Adivasi sellers in finding correct weight with digital weighing machine.

FCRA

By the end of this year Adivasimitra made claims for 13888 acres of land by 3829 tribal families under FCRA. Training programs were conducted for Forest rights committee members on FRA and PESA acts.

Youth Emplyment

835 unemployed youth were identified from the project area. From them 284 youth that are keen on exploring employment opportunities within agriculture and allied activities were identified. Meetings were conducted with identified youth and discussed various local, agri based livelihood opportunities. Data of land and resources available with the selected young farmers. These youth are encouraged to join MACS and form in to FPGs in their villages.

Horticulture, Agriculture, ITDA were consulted for appropriate training programs to create local agro based employment. Mushroom cultivation, Nursery, Vegetable cultivation, Marketing activities were selected by majority of the youth as interested activities.

Culture

Conducted household survey in Mullumetta, Barindibanda and Boddaputtu villages of Tadigiri Panchayat for culture preservation and promotional activities. Village profiles and history were created. gathered information on Cultural activities, traditional practices, rituals, festivals, songs, dance forms, langeage. Group activities were organised to gather information on day to day activities of the community, Agricultural activities, seeds, seedling & sowing methods, tools and implements, management of livestock, fodder, rearing, different fire woods & collection, water resources, ornaments, traditional medicine, rituals in marriages & festivals, seasonal activities, rituals associated with various live stages etc.

Covid – 19 Awareness

At the end of the year during March 2020 Covid pandemic affected communities in the operational area. activities severely. Awareness activities were carried on precautions, safety measures on the Corona disease.

Education

Activities in Education focused especially on to bridge the gap between children's mother tongue and medium of instruction in a more scientific way by involving local communities. 720 children from Anganwadis and schools in 24 villages of Kuvi speaking community in two panchayats of Tadigiri and Mottujore are benefitting from this program. The program has resulted..

- Increased enrolment in Schools and Anganwadi Centres and no one dropout found in 24 schools of Allamputtu and Peddagaruvu Clusters. From the last two years, we achieved 100% enrolment and retention in Schools.
- 2. Schools have 40 % learning levels in the project initial stage, now we enhanced up to 80% of learning level among children in 24 schools.
- 3. Ten Treasure houses and Science Labs installed in school premises. Out of 10 Treasure houses and Science Labs, Seven are initiating by Teachers and VEV's.
- **4.** Sanctioned 6 new Angawadicentre buildings in Allamputtu Cluster. Out of six, two Angawadi building construction completed.
- **5.** In Allamputtu Complex, Two school buildings were sanctioned and construction process is going on and completed connected roads for two schools.
- 6. The five schools have connected water facilities from gravity water source with the support of ITDA.
